January Speaker: Lianne Harris Racioppo

Undressed: A History of Hygiene



In this lively, visual 1-hour presentation, Lianne Harris scrubs away the surface of what we might think of hygiene—soap and shampoo--to the essential reality of survival in less than sanitary conditions. From personal practices to religious, political, and cultural intervention, relax and soak up a short history of hygiene.

Lianne currently works as the History, Culture and Social Studies Resource Specialist Consultant with the Toronto Board of Education and curriculum advisor for Upper Canada College, having taught over 80 000 teachers and students (usually in authentic period clothing). In 2003, she was selected by W.O.M.A.D. as one of Toronto's Women of Influence and in 2009 was invited to be a contributing author of the Canadian best-seller

business/self-help book, 'The Power of Women United'. Appearing on TV and interviewed on the radio many times, she is always happy to have a live--and virtual-- audience.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT


We did it,
