### **Guest Speaker for May was:- Donald James Waters OAM:-**


An artist in his own right and an inspiration to young students at School who don't believe in themselves.

This tour is restricted to only 24 people so please put your name on the sheet at reception as soon as possible if you wish to attend.


**All attendees must wear enclosed shoes and have long hair tied up neatly when in the laboratories.**
