The Guest Speaker for June was Saalihah Seedat who is a highly qualified Pharmacist and among her

various other achievements is a My Health for Life facilitator. This "Mom of 3" spoke to us firstly about Healthy Eating. We heard about the Dietary Guidelines, Foods to Limit, and Portion Control. A brochure was handed out but as there were not enough for all members, the information can be obtained from the following website – <u>www.eatforhealth.gov.au</u> She also showed some very interesting slides on how many teaspoons of sugar are contained in certain drinks – some of us were very surprised! Her talk showed us all how to make healthier choices as part of our everyday life.

For Healthy Eating, we should aim for the following:

Total Fat – less than 10g per 100g Saturated Fat – less than 3g per 100g Sugars - less than 15g per 100g Fibre - **greater** than 3g per serve Sodium - less than120mg per 100g

Saalihah then spoke on the My Health for Life Program which is a State funded 3 month program based on health and lifestyle modifications to prevent chronic disease. Eligible participants undergo 5 sessions with the aid of workbooks either Online via Zoom or in person at a Logan Library. It was heartening to find that at least 6 of our members registered their interest in this program.

TEN PIN BOWLING



We were given a Tea-making Ceremony with meditation, morning tea followed by a guided tour of the Temple and Pagoda.


The Pagoda is the resting place of Buddha's body, sitting on a lotus flower.



Finally ended up working for an international engineering company in Brisbane with their head office in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada. That started a 15 year long journey within their Finance, IT and Training departments that sent me around Australia and the world. I supported their offices in China, Indonesia, New Caledonia, India, and Australasia, South Africa, and in Canada if they were working late and didn't have anyone on line to help with their issues in their region. I taught the SAP system, time application and the setting up of Projects, Reporting, Budgets, and setting up new systems when we acquire new companies to come into line with our systems, and the most important of all was how to get out of jail quickly to the engineers and all support staff. Very Interesting and no one day was ever the same. Technology is a wonder and what you can do from your desk which affects people thousands of miles away is a wonderful and dangerous thing.

I am now starting this new section of my life - RETIREMENT.... Where I can enjoy travel, reading, craft, going for coffee with friends, volunteering where you meet all different kinds of people who, if you take the time, all have wonderful stories to tell.
