December: No guest speaker - Christmas Lunch

January: Stan Perkins (and wife Wilma), Honorary Life President, World Masters Athletics

The 1994 World Masters Games held in Brisbane took me back to a wonderful time in my working life that for many years was in Sport Management. Unlike the great Championships that are on our television screens currently, 1994 was the resurrection of a great idea that had already failed despite the possibilities it had promised. Brisbane City and the Queensland Government combined with the sporting organisations, administrations, officials and the business community to create an outcome that was way beyond expectations and ignited a growth in World participation in Masters Sport that has continued year by year. Athletics is still probably the best organised and highest participant masters sport on a world level.

February: Fiona Muller: Flood Recovery and Disaster Preparation and Management

Fiona Muller has a Bachelor in Social Science majoring in Counselling and has worked at Kingston East Neighbourhood Group since 2017 in various roles such as the Counsellor, Facilitated the Older Persons Action Program and has now been funded to work in both Flood Recovery and The Older Persons Flood Alliance.

These roles have been funded by both State and Federal Governments. The aim is to help those that have been flooded from the 2022 Floods in their recovery and to increase the self-efficacy of Seniors, in order to ensure they are educated, prepared and have an actionable plan, in the event of another flood, and contribute to a healthier, stronger and more inclusive senior community in Logan.

Her work also includes preparation for any disaster, including fires and what you should have stored in the cloud or on a USB Thumb Drive.

GUEST SPEAKER – Tracey Murray, CEO of Empower Assistance Dogs


Tracey Murray, her volunteer Therapy handlers and of course the 2 Assistance Dogs, and the other Therapy dogs were given a very warm welcome by our members, and it was wonderful to see them interact with the dogs.

Tracey and her husband Craig founded Empower Assistance Dogs in 2016 and they are both certified individual trainers. The purpose of this not for profit charity is to provide professionally trained government certified assistance dogs to persons with disabilities to enhance their independence and quality of life. The funds raised go towards breeding, raising and training the dogs to then, be placed with disabled recipients and certified under the Qld Government Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dog Act 2009. I think you will agree that the organization does an amazing job considering that they receive no Government funding. Their on-line shop sells Men's and Women's Empower Biscuit Shirts and Empower Go Bags to help with

fund raising.



The videos Tracey presented showed just what a significant difference an Assistance dog can have on a disabled person's life, and they brought a tear or two to our eyes. The world of disability is so broad and the videos highlighted how the assistance dog must be trained to suit the individual needs of the disabled person.





Tracey and Craig have been able to grow their services to help more people by implementing a breeding program (and we met Joker, who is a breeding dog), puppy raising program and school raising and training program, therapy dog team and in 2020 they commenced a new "Owner Coached Assistance Dog Program". I spoke with John after the meeting who is the Principal of Loganlea High School. He told me that a Therapy dog can de-escalate a student situation in a couple of minutes, which would normally take him approx 10 minutes to defuse. He considers them a very valuable asset.

Assistance dogs are trained to do "Task Work" which can include some of the following – seizure response, minor balance skills, picking up dropped items, opening/closing doors, turning on lights, and so much more. Under the Act, they have to be trained to do at least 3 tasks for their handler.

Our driver Henry entertained us with trivia and stories along the journey.






