February: Fiona Muller: Flood Recovery and Disaster Preparation and Management

Accompanying Fiona will be Jim Ferguson – from Logan City Council Disaster Management Team – and also an active SES Volunteer.

Fiona Muller has a Bachelor in Social Science majoring in Counselling and has worked at Kingston East Neighbourhood Group since 2017 in various roles such as the Counsellor, Facilitated the Older Persons Action Program and has now been funded to work in both Flood Recovery and The Older Persons Flood Alliance.

These roles have been funded by both State and Federal Governments. The aim is to help those that have been flooded from the 2022 Floods in their recovery and to increase the self-efficacy of Seniors, in order to ensure they are educated, prepared and have an actionable plan, in the event of another flood, and contribute to a healthier, stronger and more inclusive senior community in Logan.

Her work also includes preparation for any disaster, including fires and what you should have stored in the cloud or on a USB Thumb Drive.

March: Eddy Kerkhofs

His topic will be "The questions about aeroplanes you always had but never asked."

Eddy suggests he take an interactive approach and can draw on his career experiences as a NATO fighter pilot, Cathay Pacific Boeing 747 captain, current business jet captain, and as a recreational aerobatic and glider pilot. So he can cover aviation specific questions Probus members might have based on their passenger experiences such as what happens before and during a flight that people take to go on a holiday. He will also talk about recreational aeroplanes, military fighter jets, large air transport planes. He owns an aerobatic aircraft he bases at Boonah plus a high performance glider.

<u>April:</u> Megan Norris – Crime Journalist

Megan Norris is a UK-trained journalist and award-winning author whose portfolio includes covering some of Australia's most notorious crimes.

GUEST SPEAKERS JANUARY 2024 – STAN AND WILMA PERKINS

Stan grew up in Rosebank (17 miles from Lismore in northern NSW) and then Lismore before embarking on a career of 18 years in the NSW Public Service Justice Department. Wilma and Stan went to Richmond River High School, married in 1969, had 5 children and then moved to Brisbane in 1980 seeking better opportunities for their children and to be nearer family.

Stan was a successful shot-put thrower but shoulder injuries from rugby league impacted his career. As such, he became interested in the administration side of the sport and he developed his career in this direction. In 1982, he joined Queensland Athletics Club and over the following years held many roles on Committees, as Secretary, and President. As well as roles in Australia, Stan also served as Secretary and President of Oceania Masters Region which culminated in him being elected in 1995 as Oceania Region Representative to the World Masters Athletics Council.

In 2009, Stan was elected as President, World Masters Athletics and he retired from this position 9 years' later. He was appointed Honorary LIFETIME World Masters President, Malaga, Spain. This was the first such appointment in the organisation's history. Quite impressive!



Stan has also been involved in organising the World Masters Games from 1994 until 2002. He was the Chief Executive of the Games and saw it bloom with rapidly increasing International numbers as well as Australian

competitions. His last Games in 2002 attracted more than 10,000 athletes in about 30 sports spread over two weeks. Stan has visited 63 countries around the world working for the Masters Athletics.

Wilma, I am sure you will agree was a very informative and entertaining speaker. She has been involved in Masters Athletics (a not for profit organisation) for over 37 years. She specialises in Pole Vault and said she has missed the mat a couple of time – Ouch!! She has also competed in the Decathlon which is a total of 10 track and field events.

Wilma is very athletic, and some of her records over the years have not been broken. These include for running the Women's W30 - 100M, W35 – 200M and 400M, for Pole Vault W45, for Pentathlon W30 and W35, for Heptathlon W30. An amazing achievement.

Queensland Masters Athletics Association (QMA) promotes fitness, fun and friendship through a range of athletic activities for everyone. Membership starts from 30 years through to 100+. The competitions run in 5 year age groups across all track and field events. Masters Athletics is all about participation so there are no qualification standards required for any masters event held. In 2023, QMA celebrated their 50th Anniversary. If you do not wish to compete, you can volunteer and there are many different jobs available to suit.

Wilma said it is not about being the best – it is about beating your own time and having fun. Any takers?

Debby Snape

I was born in 1952 and grew up in Sydney NSW. I had one brother and we grew up in Narwee, which was a new area about 22klms southwest of Sydney CBD. We loved the beach and had lots of great camping holidays.

In 1968 my first job when I left school was as a Clerk in a Stock Brokers office in the middle of Sydney. It was only a 25 minute train trip and Sydney was a vibrant city. Sometime being on the "Floor" at the Stock Exchange was so exciting with all the yelling bidding for stocks. It was a time of boom or bust. The Sydney shops were fantastic seeing me spend most of my wages on Carnaby Street fashions while still living at home with my parents. Lots of fun times going to movies, dances and country drives with a car club we belonged to.



I moved out of home and started "flatting" when I was 18, many fun years sharing houses with a variety of interesting people. After about 4 years working for the Stock Broker, I decided to work closer to home and worked at a Film Studio as a Receptionist which was quite exciting seeing commercials and short films being made. Even filled in for models sometimes if they didn't show. I then changed direction again and became a Receptionist/Account Clerk for a group of Doctors, in a very busy General Practice.

I met my husband, David in 1968 when I was 16 and he was 17. We married in April 1973 and bought a home unit at Penshurst where we lived for 2 ½ years. We then bought a new house in a brand new suburb called Sherwood Hills/Bradbury in Campbelltown, where we lived for 23 years. It was a lovely leafy suburb.

We had two children, Nathan was born in 1978 and Rachel was born in 1980 in Camden Hospital. Happy years doing playgroup, tennis and then school activities including dancing, band, Scouts, Girl Guides and yearly holidays to the beach or the mountains. We were inaugural members of the Bradbury Lions Club where we did lots for the community and had a great social life with them for 28 years. We enjoyed line dancing for many years with wonderful people with so much social fun which took us far and near and kept us fit. I went back to work at a different Doctor's Surgery close to home when the kids started school, part time until about 1993 when I started working for a Specialist Rheumatologist with visiting ENT Surgeon, Neurologist and Neurosurgeon as a Receptionist/Dictaphone typist. I stayed with that group for 14 years.

I also took on a second job as a side hustle in 2004 as an ENJO Consultant, doing in-home demonstrations of how to eliminate chemical cleaners. This microfibre technology is amazing and I did so well with all the business training they provided, that I left my day job to concentrate on my ENJO career. I was inspired to do well by the chance of earning free international travel. I qualified for about 12 international holidays with my ENJO family travelling all over the world for about 12 years. I am still a Consultant, but semi retired. I have used ENJO Fibres and water exclusively to clean my home, car and myself for the last 20 years and will never use harmful chemicals. David and I also did yearly overseas trips for a while.

Tragedy struck us in 1997 when our beautiful 18 year old son, Nathan, was taken from us. He was an apprentice, living at home with us, when on the evening of 12th March 1997 we went to visit 2 of his former school friends who were renting a house in the next suburb. They were to have take away dinner and play the play-station. Four armed men broke in to rob the house and they viciously murdered him, shooting him through the head. Our whole world was shattered. I won't go into too much detail but our lives changed forever. We had 4 years going through the court system, 40 odd appearances in local courts and two trials in Supreme Court in Sydney. The co-accused served short gaol sentences and the shooter got off because of insufficient evidence. He was gaoled latter for having a drug lab. Our daughter, Rachel was 16 at the time and was very badly affected.

After much struggle, years of counselling and learning many healing strategies we are in a good place now appreciating the years we had with Nathan. We moved house a year after to Mount Annan in Camden. Rachel moved to Queensland in 2001 for 3 years and then returned to us in 2004. With her husband, Leigh, she had Lilly in 2006 and Rebecca in 2008. They were lovely years with little grand babies. They again moved to Queensland in 2015 and I visited them very regularly.

David finally retired in 2018 after working at the same firm for 51 years. He started in 1967 as an apprentice Motor Mechanic with the NRMA in Pyrmont Sydney and progressed through the ranks holding many different positions including Vehicle Inspector writing long, detailed reports on vehicles and being an Expert Witness in some court cases about motor vehicles. He has even spoken on talk-back radio shows about cars. When he moved to Head Office in Sydney CBD he was in the Veteran, Vintage and Classic Car Department, being their Head Underwriter. He travelled quite a lot to various car shows and clubs.

In 2018 we moved to Queensland to be close to Rachel and the girls. We bought a beautiful place on an acre of land at Tanah Merah. It was a tropical paradise. We joined the Springwood Probus club to make friends and have enjoyed that.

Tragedy again in October 2020 when David was cleaning the gutters of our Tanah Merah house and fell off the roof. He suffered 38 broken bones and a head injury. He was in Princess Alexander hospital for about 2 months on life support at first. Even though he fractured his spine in 15 places, luckily his spinal cord was not affected so he could be taught to walk again. He had a lot of memory loss and was re-taught all daily functions. He was then in rehab in Logan hospital for another month. After that we had therapists in the home every day. He is a miracle man to have survived and still has Speech Therapy, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy.

We moved from our Tanah Merah house as the upkeep of the grounds was then too much for us. We bought a house on a smaller block in Loganholme in 2021 and then when my mother came to live with us that year we moved again to the house we are in now in 2022. It was more suitable to the wheelchair for Mum. Sadly, Mum passed away in August last year. My health has suffered over the last several years and our daughter, Rachel has been our saviour, looking after us all.

Joining Loganholme Probus has introduced us to more lovely friends.

Looking forward to a more settled life now.
